As previously discussed we went from a Management Board to a Governance Board structure, with a distinct operational level working with the Board and the administrator to manage the day to day running of the club. I must say that in all honesty this is still a “work in progress”.

I have often said that one needs to understand the history of the club and have some knowledge of where we have come from to this point before attempting to instigate change. Sadly, on several occasions the current Board did not reflect on this advice well enough before embarking on some radical change. Unfortunately, this put me in the difficult position of opposing some of these decisions. Not the change, but the manner and speed in which it was trying to be achieved.

This club is fortunate to have a strong group of life members who are still very passionate about the well being and success of the club. In Peter Fitzsimmons we have a Patron who brings a vast amount of knowledge and experience, both in the corporate world and Surf Lifesaving. It is absolutely imperative that future Boards take counsel from these people. We will then prosper as a club and not repeat the mistakes of the past.

As an active lifeguard it has given me a great deal of satisfaction to see the marked improvement in our core activity this season. This is in no small measure down to the commitment and organisational skills of Chelan, our Director of Lifeguarding. It has been encouraging to see new faces step up and assist in this area and it bodes well for the future if we can continue the momentum achieved this past season.

The “Rookie” lifeguard programme was another success. The club is now starting to reap the benefits of this ongoing work and the enthusiasm shown by this group of young people is worthy of mention.

The icing on the cake this season would have to be winning the Allan Gardner trophy for top club at the nationals. This is only the second time this has been achieved and to my mind, it was the way we won this time that made it special. Whilst not being at Ohope I was at least fortunate enough to use the club computer to nervously read the live updates during the weekend patrol. I should not have worried as our competitors showed the benefits of good preparation and teamwork to come home over 30 points clear. Outstanding!

A special mention for Spindles and Holly on the long slog that is required to realise this goal. Also to Stephen and his team for giving our athletes the best chance to do well.

Prior to writing this report I usually tend to have a read through past reports I have written. I came across this from my 2005 report that I feel is still very relevant today:

“In my years of involvement with the Mount I have learnt that it is made up of a wide range of characters, who have an equally wide range of opinions. Differing views have lead to many interesting discussions. However, the common theme that was held by all of these diverse individuals, was that whatever they did as an individual or collectively, it was with the best interests of the club in mind.”

To the current Board, KJ as President and Peter Fitzsimmons as Patron, thank you for your time, commitment, challenges and laughs. You are all a great bunch of people.

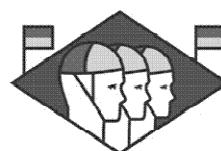
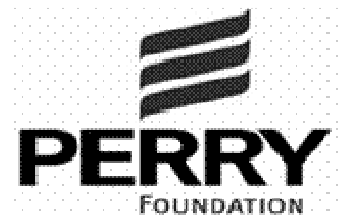

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First season of the new club structure in my opinion has come together pretty well and is setting a great base to build from. Sure there have been some challenges but that's part of getting together and working towards the common goal.

Financially the club has performed well and sits in a strong position to go forward. Updating our accounting systems which will improve the monitoring of our operation and help us forecast better.

As I have said in the past our club operates in a different environment and is called on to respond to a wide range of events. Keeping our equipment in top operational condition is a priority. This year we have updated the Four Wheel Drive, both Quads and an IRB. A new Surfboat arrived just in time for the season start, along with 8 skis and rescue boards. Junior surf also purchased 11 boards.

The continued support through grants has allowed the club to update the majority of our Lifeguarding equipment. First aid equipment and supplies were updated early in the season and we have planned for replacement and rotation at the beginning of this coming season.

A trial sending patrol reminders through text messages has worked well and should be expanded for the coming season to cover a wider range of communication. In order for us to get the best out of the system we need our members to keep us updated on any changes to their mobile phones.

Competition equipment needed a lot of attention before the start of the season and this was completed in time. Continued maintenance during the season kept the majority of equipment available and we expect to have all end of season repairs completed by the AGM.

Congratulations to Stephen, Spindles and their team for another Allan Gardner title. No easy feat and a credit to all of you.

The club was involved in three of its own events during the year, Surfbreaker Triathlon, Round the Mount swim and Bridge to Bridge swim. These events were contracted to Sheryl McLay of Shore Break Aquatics and all ran very well especially with the very short notice given to the club on taking the Bridge to Bridge over and the Surfbreaker being run by the club again after many years controlled by other organisations. I look forward to both parties developing these events further.

Thank you to our club sponsors and supporters, Lifeguards, Managers, helpers and competitors for another great season. I look forward to seeing you all at the start of the fast approaching new season.

Congratulations team, we have achieved another summer on the beach with no drowning. Thank you for your dedication to patrol participation. This year we saw the addition of a fifth patrol and an operations team to implement the key strategies for the club in relation to lifeguarding. I was pleased with the turn out and support for our refresher day which highlighted to our instructors a number of basic lifeguarding skills we would like to focus on through the year. My vision for our 2010 refresher includes more time for instruction and practice of these basics before working through the refresher assessment.

We held a scenario weekend which was well received by the participants and provided an opportunity to practice a number of typical rescue scenarios for our environment. Participants ranged from our most recent qualified lifeguards to our most senior lifeguards.

Our First aid and rescue equipment has seen a number of additions this year and I would like to thank Bruce Western, John Roy our medical advisor and our patrols captains for their input in this outcome. We were fortunate to have the fantastic support of the Mackay Strathnaver Trust which saw the replacement of all our lifeguarding vehicles during the season and Lion Foundation for funding the replacement of an IRB hull and motor.

We established an IRB training program during the winter that resulted in a strong group of candidates participate in the IRB Drivers and Crewpersons weekend at Raglan.

It was fantastic to see such a focussed and keen group of Rookies this year. Their dedication to the program and lifeguarding was impressive and I look forward to seeing them in their red and yellow uniforms this coming summer.

We joined forces with our Papamoa and Omanu counterparts to participate in a lifeguard award academy this year. The experience was rewarding for both participants and instructors, learning from a number of people with different experience and backgrounds. This combined with our internal training programs saw 24 people qualify with their lifeguard award this year and join our teams on the beach.

Going forward my focus is on providing increased opportunities for upskilling and learning, ensuring our lifeguards have and are trained to use effective equipment for our environment to prevent drowning at our beaches. Thank you to my fellow Board members for their support and encouragement through the year.

I would like to thank the lifeguarding team who implemented and drove the programs and facilities discussed above including Clayton Kellett (Lifeguard Training), Brent Warner (Rookie Lifeguards), Bruce Weston (Lifeguarding Equipment) and Jason Watts (IRB Officer). I have been impressed and motivated by the large number of people contributing to achieving our vision to be the number one lifeguarding service in NZ. Thank you everyone for your input.

We trialed a couple of new initiatives during the season, the first being "bring a friend", the second a mock Surf Carnival to show the new participants and their families what happens at a Surf Carnival and the third was at the end of the season when we involved the parents in a "fun" morning. All three seemed to be well received (particularly the third one) and we intend to repeat this for next season.

We have had a marked increase in numbers in our 10-13 years, which in part is due to our fantastic Ocean Athlete programme delivered by John Bryant and Holly Moczydlowski.

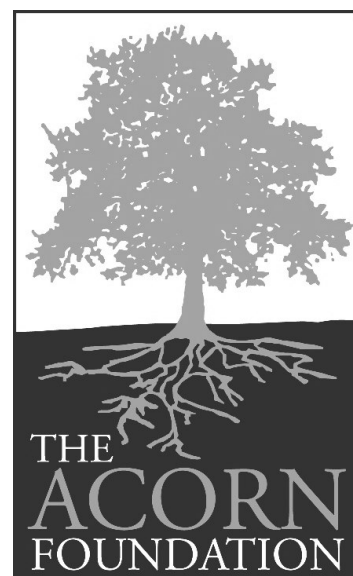

I would also like to make special mention and thank all the coaches, Bruce Weston and Caroline Bird for their support throughout the season.

The other thing that sometimes is forgotten is the people that come to swim at our beach benefit as well, they are getting faster and fitter lifeguards on patrol to look after them.

There will be some big challenges next year as MMLS now are the hunted and not the hunter nationally. Holly Moczydlowski –thank you for everything. Welcome to the coaching ranks now and thank you for all the advice you offer to the athletes and myself.

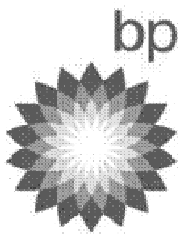
