We will be taking 20-25 Boaties into this season. That's 25 financial members/25 Lifeguards/25 Senior Athletes & we include in our ranks- Patrol Captains, Lifeguard Award Instructors & Board members.

Within this group we are blessed with some very good rower resource, but have neglected the importance of development. This season we will be putting focus on Sweep development & the challenge of developing an age grade crew.

Probably our most radical direction change will be the implementation of a training concept where we will work together with the Omanu & Papamoa Clubs, in Club night style training as a collective group, instead of hiding away from each other.

Lastly, as part of the operation level we have been asked to submit an annual budget for the running of Surf Boats. As a result of creating this budget, through Surf Boat specific sponsorship support, we have proven our financial self sufficiency.

So looking at where we have come from, where we are now, & where we are heading, we see Surf Boats going from strength to strength.

It gives me great pleasure to write my inaugural report as President of the Mount Maunganui Lifeguard Service a volunteer organisation that I believe is second to none and has provided me with a great deal of personal satisfaction. I am proud to lead the Service and look forward to the upcoming season with anticipation. The 2010/11 season will and should always be remembered for the tragedy in Christchurch which puts the minor challenges we face into perspective and our thoughts go out to all those who have lost loved ones in what has and continues to be an extremely difficult period in New Zealand history. The Earthquake and resulting damage caused Surf Life Saving New Zealand to transfer the centenary National Championship and associated celebrations to the our home beach which was a bonus and a pleasure to host.

While SLSNZ is facing some challenges the problems have been identified and resolved and robust budgets and financial controls put in place. An interim Chief Executive has been employed and I am very confident that the measures taken will ensure a base foundation which allows the Surf Lifesaving movement to evolve in a stronger position. In conclusion I can confirm the current failings are nothing to do with Project Groundswell however should you wish to discuss or understand the organisation failings further please don't hesitate to contact me.

On the sporting front the pinnacle of our year must be retaining the Allan Gardner trophy as the overall winner of the National Championships by a record 36 points which confirms an awesome team result and endorses the pedigree of our competitors.

Overall the season must surely be one of our more successful and I am confident that with the new administration structure in place and with Leigh and her team we are in an extremely good position to enhance our Lifeguard Service delivery model while maintaining our leadership in the sporting field.

I look forward to being part of an exciting and ground breaking future and working with you all in the coming season.

Our focus this year was to increase the quality of basic lifeguarding skills demonstrated by our lifeguards at the annual refresher. The instructor team was very impressed with the quality of the CPR demonstrated through our refresher program for the 2010/11 season. This was the result of extra time invested by everyone at the refresher to discuss and practice these skills.

For the scenario weekend we practiced a range of lifeguarding skill focused on search and rescue and basic first aid. The participants particularly benefited from the experience of a twilight mass land and sea search co-ordinated by Jason Watts. We had both experienced and newly qualified lifeguards and a great mix of instructors.

We implemented to split patrol roster this year to allow our lifeguards to work with a range of different people with different skills, the goal being to improve the overall lifeguarding skill level within the club. The feedback, particularly from our future leaders and patrol captains, was very positive and this was a successful program for the 2010/11 season.

I would like to thank the lifeguarding team who ran our lifeguarding programs this year including Clayton Kellett (Lifeguard Training), Mara Haitzma (Rookie Lifeguards), Bruce Weston (Lifeguarding Equipment) and Jason Watts (IRB Officer).

It's a great thing to watch kids having fun on the beach and in the water with their friends and to know that they are also acquiring skills which could one day save their own lives and possibly those of others.



I'd be happy to be proved wrong but I doubt there is any other sport which offers the mix of sport, life skills and friendship for everyone from 5 year olds in a Sunday morning junior programme right through to 80 year olds competing at Masters Carnivals and patrolling.

In 2010/2011 our flagship Sunday programme continued to run well, thanks primarily to a mixture of new and experienced coaches who front up to the beach each weekend to impart their knowledge and help our kids develop their surf skills. Next season we will be looking to recruit new parents into the coaching system and looking to use a 'buddy' and/or Assistant Coach set up. We will also look to increase the number of participants in all age groups.

A couple of new initiatives were trialed during the season, including giving the younger children IRB rides early in the season, participating in a series of "warm up" carnivals, running a holiday programme for 8 and 9 year olds and, after a false start due to the weather, we ran our club champs and prizegiving as a "one dayer" which proved to be very successful.

We had another increase in numbers in our 10-13 year olds, which in part is due to our Oceans 11 and holiday programmes delivered by John Bryant and Holly Moczydlowski.

It's the end of another season, and wow, hasn't it been a season to remember! With many outstanding achievements, the best one was done collectively as a Club. It has been a wonderful team effort this season. No one individual athlete, coach, manager, Board member, parent, sponsor, etc, won the Allan Gardner Trophy – it was the whole team that did it and all of these people were that team.

The change in the new Board structure is something that we can be proud of. A lot of people always come up and congratulate us on a job well done but credit needs to be given to the whole club. Last year the MMLS Board made a big change and in my opinion, this has helped me and the club out in a big way. They get to rub shoulders with the best, front up to the start line and in some cases beat them. This trip also makes the athletes aware how good other surf athletes / lifeguards are internationally. The bonus for the club is they learn from this and when they come home their training becomes a lot more disciplined and the squad members that didn't go see the intensity that is need to succeed internationally. This is a great membership retention tool for the club and benefits the public who swim at our beach, as the lifeguards are faster and fitter as a direct result of competition.

The National Champs were once again a huge success for the club. Our performance this season was a step up from 2009/2010 season. As we are maturing as a club / team we are getting more professional in the way we compete and approach our competitors. With the tsunami warning on the Saturday of the Nationals, two days of competition were compressed into one. We not only managed to stay calm about the number of events we had to compete in but we were ruthless towards our opposition. This was an overwhelming win for the club in the 100th year of Surf Life Saving in New Zealand and one for the record books.

Regionally we continue to be a leader in Surf Sports. Winning the Eastern Regional Pool Champs, the Eastern Region Surf Champs and the Northern Regional Champs showed the depth we are developing across the board. We were under strength at these events, with several key athletes away, so it was awesome to see some of the developing athletes step up with key performances that led us to victory. Like all clubs we have to keep developing all areas of the club to remain at the top and as long as we don't get complacent about our success but keep striving to improve each year. I can only see a brighter future for the Mount Maunganui Life-guard Service in Surf Sports.

In Junior Surf we continue to move forward. Holly does a great job of preparing the 10 – 13 year olds and with the introduction of Brooke Shergold running the 8 and 9yr olds holiday programme we are now starting to have very skilled juniors. We make the most ground with these kids when we put the emphasis on their skills, rather than long hard sessions. These young athletes are already fit, as they run around all day plus have other sport training programmes they are involved in. If we continue to upskill these young athletes, they will be ready to work hard when they join our surf sports programme and we will be more likely to retain them long term.

We will have some big challenges this coming season as Nationally we are the hunted, not the hunter. Some exciting ideas will be revealed for the future of surf sports. 2011/12 will be a very big season, with the National Champs in March, followed two weeks later by the Australian Surf Lifesaving Champs, then in November Rescue 2012 in Adelaide, Australia.

To meet these challenges I will be asking all of our Surf Athletes to:

- Train to the best of their ability
- Complete all of their patrols
- Answer their emails early, so we can be very well organised as a club
- Make sure their time management is awesome so they get all work, school and training done
- Be very ruthless in competition
